### TRIBAL CANOE JOURNEY


The annual Tribal Canoe Journey is one of the largest cultural events in the Indigenous world, with the coastal tribes of the Pacific Northwest gathering to celebrate their traditional canoe culture with their youth. The Journey has been a yearly event in the Pacific Northwest since 1989.

Canoe families from various coastal regions including Alaska, British Columbia, Washington State, Oregon, Hawaii and California paddle their canoes for up to two weeks visiting each tribal home as they journey to the host tribe for the final protocol.

This is our 6<sup>th</sup> journey. As we join our Nisqually Canoe family, we are given tents and a sleeping bag and we set off. The participants paddle each day to a different reservation, where they share their culture through music and dance, while enjoying the "potlatch" hospitality of the host tribe.
